

Using YouTube in Edpuzzle

As of **February 13, 2026**, Wabash City Schools will be blocking YouTube on all **student devices in grades PK–10**. In addition to being a constant distraction, it has become increasingly difficult to effectively filter inappropriate videos and advertisements.

That said, YouTube is a highly valuable educational resource—**when used at teacher discretion**. To allow continued classroom use, any YouTube videos shown to students in grades PK–10 must now be **embedded in Edpuzzle**. The district has a **district-wide Edpuzzle license**, and the process is quick and easy.

There will be **no changes** for:

- Teachers
- Students in **grades 11–12**

You may still show YouTube videos directly from your **teacher iPad or Mac**.

Step 0: Create an Edpuzzle Account (if needed)


If you do not already have an Edpuzzle account, follow the link below

Before signing up, make sure you are **logged into your school email account** in the browser you are using. (I *strongly recommend*: Do **not** use a browser where you are signed into a personal @gmail.com account, as this can cause login and access issues.)

Step 1: Add Your YouTube Video

Once logged in to Edpuzzle, **copy and paste the YouTube URL** into the Edpuzzle search bar and press **Enter** on your keyboard.




Step 2: Edit the Video (Optional)

After pressing Enter, you will see a preview of your video. From here, you may:

- **Trim (Cut)** the video
- **Add popup questions** at specific points
- **Record a voiceover** (*not available for YouTube videos*)

When you are finished, click “**Finish**.”



Step 3: Assign the Video (Canvas & Seesaw)


Canvas Users

- Choose External Tool as the submission type
- Click Find, then select Edpuzzle
- If this is your first time, you will be prompted to sign in and name your class

Seesaw Users

1. In Edpuzzle, go to My Content
2. Check the box next to the video you want to assign
3. Click Assign at the bottom
4. Create a class, set a due date, and adjust any additional settings
5. Copy the student invite link
6. Paste the link into a Seesaw post along with the assignment details
